Southampton County School Division believes that the curriculum and goals for the gifted and talented students should provide opportunities that allow for individualization and enrichment. Academic requirements within a differentiated program are based on the learning style of the student. The Gifted and Talented Program is offered to students in order to realize their maximum potential and foster lifelong In addition to the academic learning. classes, the system also provides an educational program for artistically gifted students in visual arts for grades four to twelve.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The Gifted Education Program in Southampton County is comprised of:

***** The Genesis Program

Serves the identified gifted children in grades K-2 during a once a week pull-out program at each school

***** The Discover Program

Serves identified gifted children in grades 3-5 who meet one day per week at Riverdale Elementary School

***** The Challenge Program

Serves identified gifted children in grades 6-7 in a year-long class at Southampton Middle School

* High School

Advanced placement and dual enrollment classes

REFERRAL PROCESS

The referral process for the academic program occurs in the Fall and Spring of each school year. Referrals and/or nominations may be made by completing the program referral form which may be obtained from the guidance counselor or a member of the gifted education staff. Students may be nominated by their parents, peers, community members, teachers, and administrators.

Results of standardized tests (OLSAT for grades 2 and 6) along with Kindergarten and General Checklists are reviewed for possible referrals. After the screening process, names are placed in a pool for further identification by the gifted committee.

REFERRAL PROCESS

The referral process for the visual arts program occurs in March of each year. Students submit portfolios which are judged by art professionals. Referrals and/or nominations may be made by completing the referral form which may be obtained from the guidance counselor or a member of the gifted education staff. Students may be nominated by their parents, peers, community members, teachers, and administrators.

An exploratory art program is offered to students in grades 4-5. This is an enrichment class for students showing art potential. Students are recommended for this program by the elementary art teacher.
