Welcome to a time for new experiences in your life -- a new school, new teachers, new friends, and a newly found freedom – combining to create new opportunities for learning. Just believe and together we can work to create a culture for success. This syllabus provides important guidelines to help you achieve success in this class. *Please read it, sign it, and return it by Thursday/Friday, September 4th or 5th, 2014 (HOMEWORK).*

Course Objectives:

- Students will analyze plot development, characterization, and theme in a variety of narrative texts (SOL 7.5).
- Students will analyze language in fiction and informational texts, focusing on roots and affixes, figurative language, connotations, and word origins (SOL 7.4).
- Students will analyze informational texts, focusing on internal and external text structures, fact versus opinion statements, author's viewpoint and purpose (SOL 7.6).
- Students will continue to develop oral communication skills using verbal and nonverbal behaviors.
- Coursework is technology-infused through the use of SMART board, and associated presentation software. As well, students will have specific opportunities to use laptops and ipads in class and must abide by the SCPS *i*-safety pledge.

Each objective has several components or bullets. SOL tests will focus on the above three standards. A complete copy of the SOL's, the curriculum framework, and our SOL test blueprint can be obtained from the Virginia Department of Education website or my webpage. Cumulative benchmark tests will be given at 4 ½ and 9 week intervals.

Also, one endeavor of the language arts department is to build each student's vocabulary. One way of accomplishing this will be to work on vocabulary each week in class. Another means for accomplishing this is through required independent reading, which must be done **CONSISTENTLY** in order to produce the desired effect. (More details are given later.) For those of you who have access to a computer, a great website for building vocabulary is <u>www.freerice.com</u>.

<u>Performance Activities:</u> (include but are not limited to...)

- Independent Reading Comprehension Goals
- Reading and Writing Assignments
- Tests and Quizzes
- Checkpoints—will be given throughout each unit to check comprehension
- Benchmarks given at 4 ½ weeks and at the end of each nine weeks (cumulative)
- Class Work, Discussion, Group work, Participation, and projects
- Warm-Ups will be posted on the board when you arrive to class. You should begin working on the assignment immediately and will have 5 minutes after the tardy bell rings to complete the task.

Course Textbook: Literature Grade 7 by Holt McDougal. A set of textbooks will be kept in the classroom.

Policies and Procedures

- 1. Upon entering class, you should go immediately to your seat and:
 - a. Take out Language Arts materials including Agenda .
 - b. Place backpack in designated area.
 - c. Sharpen pencil if needed (use your own handheld sharpener or classroom sharpener)
 - d. **Copy homework** ... You are responsible for completing the homework assignment whether it is mentioned in class or not.
 - e. Complete the Warm-Up posted on the board.
- 2. If your pencil breaks, quietly raise your pencil and I will permit you to sharpen it when the time is appropriate or use your own handheld sharpener.
- 3. No passes will be handed out for you to go to your locker. If you leave your homework in a locker, you may bring it to me at the end of the day (or after a time when you go to your locker). Habitual offenders will lose this right and will be given a 0 on their homework.
- 4. If you finish your work early, you will read from your AR book until everyone has finished, or be given a remediation/extension activity. If you have surpassed your AR goal for the grading period, you may work on material from another class.
- 5. You must wait until the end of class to throw trash in the trashcan. Empty your desk of all your belongings and pack up before leaving.
- All work expecting full credit should be done "NACHO" style!!!

- 7. Absence Policy—if you miss school, it is your responsibility to view a friend's Notebook, or ask to view my own, to see what assignments/material you missed. You must obtain any makeup worksheets/material needed from me. *From the day you return to school, you have 5 days to complete the missed work.*
- 8. I expect all work to be handed in on time unless the student has an APPROVED or EXCUSED absence (please see handbook to determine what constitutes as an excused and approved absence). If the assignment is given prior to the student's absence, the student should turn in the assignment the first day he/she returns to class. If the assignment is given during the student's absence, the student will be given 5 days to complete the work. You may obtain any makeup worksheets/materials from me. For every day an assignment is late, the grade will drop 10 points. Homework policy- In order to

be a successful student, a better reader, and to **build your vocabulary**, you **must read consistently**. Therefore, I expect you to read at least 20-30 minutes from your AR book every night. More often than not, reading your AR book will be your homework. Consequently, each student will be given an AR goal every grading period and will **receive two homework grades** (interim <u>- 50% of their goal</u> and <u>9 weeks - 100% of their goal</u>). Individual rewards will be given when goals are met as well as a group reward if all students meet their individual goals.

- 9. Student hall passes are signed at teacher's discretion.
- 10. ALL papers should have PROPER HEADING in the upper right hand corner.
 - Name (first & last), #their assigned number L.A. (language arts)
 - **Block Number** $(1^{st}, 2^{nd}, 4^{th}, 5^{th}, 6^{th}, 7^{th})$
 - DATE
- 11. Changing clothes/shoes, or addressing cosmetic issues, including lip-gloss, lotion, brushing/combing hair, etc., are **NOT** acceptable classroom practices.
